The survey conducted by NCPCR on “Education and Wellbeing of Children in MICA Mining Areas of Jharkhand & Bihar” was supported by the Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation (KSCF).

KSCF has been working in those areas since 2005 and have made approximately 300 habitations completely child labour free with 100% enrollment.

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


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
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
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
Are there any cases of malnutrition among 0 to 6 years children in the village during last 6 months?




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
Are all the children in the age group of 4 to 6 receiving supplementary nutrition at Anganwadi Centre?

Do the adolescent girls (in the age group of 15 to 18 years) receive any kind of vocational/skill training which can help them getting a job in nthese habitations/villages?



in the activity of the Anganwadi Centre ? (yes/ no)**



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
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Status of Children in the age of 6 to 14 years attending schools



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
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
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Are there adolescent boys in the age of 15 to 18 years who do not attend any school in the habitation/village



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
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Do these boys receive any kind of vocational/skill training which can help them getting a job ? (yes/ no)



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GOVT INITIATES STEPS TO ELIMINATE CHILD LABOUR

Jharkhand signs MoU with Noble Laureate Kailash Satyarthi's foundation

The Jharkhand Government in order to eliminate child labour from State has inked an MoU with Kailash Satyarthi Children's Foundation (KSFC) established by Nobel Peace laureate Kailash Satyarthi.

Foundation is working extensively in mica mining areas of Koderma, where the practice of child labour is rampant. State Government has formulated laws for this but poverty is the root of child labour. We are working hard against poverty and believe that soon child labour will be eliminated along with that from Jharkhand," Das said.

He named steps like providing mica as food along with education to the children at Adivasiwadi, deployment of ashrams and sevaks besides others which have helped in upbringing of the children born in underprivileged families, especially in tribal areas.

Children in the district are involved in various stages of mica mining using simple tools to get crude mica loose stones, rocks and digging holes which are more than 10-metres deep.

Das observed that in the name of providing jobs, traffickers and rogue placement agencies are utilising mentally and financially exploited children. "The labour department has been directed to form a special cell to keep tabs on such agencies and individuals. The intent of trafficking and child labour," he said.

Pace prize winner Satyarthi, in his address, praised steps taken by the state government against trafficking and child labour. "In India, the

government is taking steps to make the poor economically capable, besides providing their children education," Das told a gathering of 10,000.
