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Key Highlights

The Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India recently presented data in response to a Lok Sabha question related to "Nirbhaya Fund" (Lok Sabha Unstarred Question No. 1903, Dt. 29.11.2019, annexed). An analysis of this data reveals minimal utilization of the allocated Nirbhaya Fund indicating non achievement of its key objective to enhance the safety and security of women in the country. The key highlights of the analysis are as follows:

- The gross sanction/allocation of funds to States/UTs from the corpus of INR 3,600 Cr stands at 2264 Cr (63% of corpus) as on November, 2019.
- 2. Despite increase in crime against women and children every year in the Country the overall utilisation of funds released to States & UTs stands at mere 11%. Only INR 252 Cr. has been utilized by States & UTs against the allocation of INR 2,264 Cr. by the Union.
- 3. The top five States ranked in terms of utilisation of funds across various schemes under the Nirbhaya Fund were Uttarakhand (50%), Mizoram (50%), Chattisgarh (43%), Nagaland (39%) and Haryana (32%).
- 4. Six states (Maharashtra, Tripura, Tamil Nadu, Manipur, West Bengal, Gujarat) and NCT of Delhi utilised less than 5% of total funds allocated to them under Nirbhaya Fund (MoWCD, MHA, Department of Justice, and Ministry of Road Transport and Highways).
- 5. Almost three fourths (74%) of the Nirbhaya Fund have been allocated under the Ministry of Home Affairs followed by Ministry of Women and Child Development (17%).
- 6. Under the programmes of the Ministry of Home Affairs the top five States in terms of utilisation of funds are Uttarakhand (71%), Mizoram (62%), Nagaland (52%), Chhattisgarh (44%) and Andhra Pradesh (39%).
- 7. The States indicating zero utilisation of Nirbhaya funds till Nov'19 are Maharashtra, Manipur, Meghalaya, Sikkim, and Tripura.
- 8. The top five states in terms of utilisation of funds under the programmes of Ministry of Women and Child Development are Chhattisgarh (43%), Mizoram (36%), Uttarakhand (35%), Sikkim (35%), Andhra Pradesh (33%) and Nagaland (33%).
- 9. The States where utilisation of funds were found allocated under the Ministry of Women and Child Development are extremely poor are West Bengal (0%), Karnataka (0%), and NCT Delhi (0%).
- 10. Maharashtra where the crimes against women and children is so high, has not even spent a single penny out of the funds allocated under Nirbhaya Fund. According to National Crime Records Bureau's Crime in India Report 2017, Maharashtra ranks 2nd in terms of number of crimes against women and 3rd in terms of number of crimes registered against children.
- 11. The Nirbhaya fund was created in the aftermath of the incident that took place in Delhi. Despite the hues and cries of the masses on the streets of Delhi after the incident, the utilization of Nirbahya Fund allocated to NCT Delhi is only 5%.

The recent crimes against women and children took place in Karnataka, Telangana, Odisha and Uttar Pradesh, the study has revealed that utilisation of allocated Nirbahaya funds by states of Karnataka, Odisha and Telangana was only 6%. The utilisation of funds by Uttar Pradesh had been a little better at 21%.

It thus appear that the state governments of Karnataka, Odisha and Telangana had completely failed in their duty to make public spaces safe for women by non utilisation of funds placed at their disposal by the union government. The only state where the utilisation has been a little better is Uttar Pradesh. However, in absolute terms even the utilisation of Nirbhaya Fund by Uttar Pradesh state government is highly unsatisfactory. That is so because 79% of the funds provided to Uttar Pradesh under Nirbhaya fund had remained unutilized/unspent.


It is also noteworthy that in no State for which the data is readily available the utilisation of Nirbhaya funds exceeds 50%. Further, out of the 36 States and UTs for which data is available, the utilisation in 18 States/UTs is less than 15% which is a testimony of utter disregard of the state governments of the issue safety of women.

Context \\\

The recent instances of rape in the country and the mass-level unrest experienced by women indicate the perfunctory attitude of stakeholders responsible for protection of women and children in the country.

The horrific gangrape and murder of a woman veterinarian in Telangana, and similar incidents in Bihar, Rajasthan and Karnataka indicate that women are as unsafe and fearful today as they were on the eve of Nirbhaya gangrape in 2012. The more disturbing fact is that the institutional response to such crimes against women and children is not only insufficient but also poor. In India, the call for action has always been reactionary; triggered by public mobilization or media trials and never preventive, preemptive and nuanced.

One such reactionary stunt was the establishment of the Nirbhaya Fund, which was announced by the Finance Minister in his 2013 budget speech, with Government contribution of Rs. 1000 Crores for empowerment, safety and security of women and girl children. The rationale for creation of such a fund was that the violence and abuse against women and girls was increasing, which left them feeling unsafe on the streets, in public transportation and in other public places. The safety of women and children still remains to be a huge concern in India, restricting their mobility, and creating a sense of inner turmoil, discouraging them to walk, work, and do their day-to-day activities freely. This also limits their access to essential services and adversely impact their development, health and wellbeing.

The Nirbhaya Fund – was created to be utilized for projects specifically designed to improve the safety and security of women in public places. It is a non-lapsable corpus fund, being administered by Department of Economic Affairs, Ministry of Finance.


Its Functioning

Under the Nirbhaya Fund the Centre gives money to the states, which in turn spend it on programmes meant for ensuring women's safety. As per the guidelines issued by Ministry of Finance on 25.03.2015 The Women and Child Development Ministry is the nodal agency for expenditure from the Nirbhaya Fund. Earlier, it was the one releasing the funds but now it examines the programmes submitted to it by the states under Nirbhaya scheme, approves them and recommends to the Department of Economic Affairs for allocating funds and releasing them.


The key schemes under which the States have been allocated money include Emergency Response Support System, Central Victim Compensation Fund, Cyber Crime Prevention against Women and Children, One Stop Centre Scheme, Mahila Police Volunteers, and Universalisation of Women Helpline Scheme.


Over the past six years the corpus of the Fund has increased to Rs. 3,600 crores through allocation in the Finance Budgets (As per information provided in Lok Sabha unstarred question No. 1739 dt. 27.07.2018). Though the Fund was instituted in 2013, its disbursement gathered pace only from 2015.

ANSWER

MINISTER OF WOMEN AND CHILD DEVELOPMENT (SHRIMATI SMRITI ZUBIN IRANI)

- Government of India has set up a dedicated fund called Nirbhaya Fund for (a) implementation of initiatives aimed at enhancing the safety and security of women in the country. Under the Nirbhaya Fund, the proposed projects should have the features like direct impact on safety and security concerns of women, optimum use of existing infrastructure, innovative use of technology, no duplication of existing government schemes/ programmes, provision for real time intervention as far as possible. strict privacy and confidentiality of women's identity and information, defined monitoring mechanism etc. The Central Ministries/ Departments, States/UTs, Autonomous and other Government Bodies can submit proposals as per the prescribed procedure. As per the guidelines issued by Ministry of Finance, Ministry of Women and Child Development is the nodal authority for appraisal of the schemes/ proposals received under Nirbhaya Fund. An Empowered Committee of officers (EC) under the Chairpersonship of Secretary, Ministry of Women and Child Development has been set up for appraising various schemes/ projects proposed to be funded from the Nirbhaya Fund.
- (b) to (e)The States/UTs-wise details (which includes Tamil Nadu) of funds sanctioned/ allocated and utilized for the projects being implemented by various Ministries/ Departments out of Nirbhaya Fund are at Annexure-I. The Empowered Committee in this Ministry in its meeting held on 22.10.2019 has appraised a project of Ministry of Home Affairs under Nirbhaya Fund for setting up/ strengthening of Women Help Desks in Police Stations in States/UTs at a cost of
